WATER RESOURCES

Water Agency Consolidation, California, Present. Conducted situation assessment and am working with executives of three water agencies who are exploring a potential consolidation. Designed phased approach so public-facing boards could vote to continue at key milestones. Process is underway at this point as boards consider threshold vote to direct staff to move forward with developing the governance structure.

Fox Canyon Groundwater Planning Facilitated Process and Mediation, California, 2020. Conducted situation assessment and convened representative stakeholder group and smaller work groups to address water management issues in the Oxnard and Pleasant Valley Basins in Southern California. Stakeholders included the groundwater agency, water resources agency, cities, agriculture, and environmental interests. CBI provided impartial facilitation for a core stakeholder group to address key initiatives around the future of water supply, basin optimization, replenishment assessment, and

reduced water allocation; a work group to assess feasibility, potential water supply, and costs for projects for modeling and planning; and a legal committee to grapple with complex issues around allocation, ramp down, and conjunctive use. CBI set up an independent web site to promote transparency.

Convening Water Leaders on Water Resilience, California, 2019. Worked with the California Governor's Office of Planning and Research and Water Foundation to convene twenty California water leaders from agricultural, community and equity, environmental, watershed planning, and water supply to develop transformative recommendations for California's Water Resilience Portfolio. CBI designed and facilitated three sessions aimed to inspire creative thinking and innovation. Ultimately, the conveners submitted a statement to the Governor to reflect the collective insights of the group. (Note, the group was unable to formerly sign due to the time limited nature of the engagement and provocative nature of the recommendations.)

California State Water Resources Control Board, California, 2018-Present. Manage comprehensive agreement to provide mediation and facilitation to resolve conflicts related to water resources and plan strategically for the agency. Support training programs as necessary to develop Board staff capacity in facilitation and collaboration.

San Luis Rey Groundwater Basin Governance, Southern California, 2017-Present. Mediate resolution of governance issues among five Native American tribes, the San Luis Rey Indian Water Authority, County of San Diego, and nine local water agencies. All are working together to develop a comprehensive plan to manage water resources for this area north of San Diego.

South American Groundwater Sub-Basin Governance Negotiation, California, 2017-2019. Mediate resolution of governance and boundary conflicts associated with implementing the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act. The negotiation involves a large regional agency, a small mostly agricultural water district, and the County of Sacramento. The parties are striving to resolve issues related to overlapping boundary claims with the State of California and a funding and governance structure to maintain independence while also cooperating to manage water resources.

Salton Sea Stakeholder Assessment and Facilitation, California, 2017-2020. Conducted stakeholder issue assessment and worked with the State of California and stakeholders to refine organizational structure to facilitate agency and interest-group input on the State's management plan implementation. Facilitated multiple advisory committees related to Salton Sea management. The Salton Sea is a water body in the desert of Southern California that is evaporating, creating air quality public health hazard and degraded ecosystems critical for migratory birds.

Salinas Valley New Public Groundwater Agency Governance Structure, California, 2016-2017. Facilitated diverse collaborative stakeholder group and mediated agreement on the governance structure for a public groundwater sustainability agency, including voting, board composition, and legal structure. Required by law, the new agency will regulate groundwater in the Salinas Valley, the only source of water for cities, rural residents, and the Valley's \$8 billion annual agricultural economy. CBI conducted an issue assessment and designed the transparent collaborative process, including SalinasGroundwater.org and a robust public outreach program to engage English and Spanish-speaking communities.

Integrated Science Review Panel Public Workshop Facilitation, California, 2016. Facilitated daylong meeting of 100 stakeholders and inter-disciplinary scientific panel that presented the conceptual model and findings on the Russian River watershed ecology in Northern California.

Sacramento Water Forum, California, 2015-2016. Facilitated discussions between the City of Sacramento and the environmental caucus to consider modifying an element tied to flows and operations on the Sacramento River of the longstanding regional Water Forum agreement.

California State Water Resources Control Board, California, 2015-2016. Provided facilitation and mediation services to the state water regulator to support implementation of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act and drought relief throughout California. Consulted on stakeholder engagement and process design. Facilitated meetings between State Board and Department of Water Resources and in regions throughout California.

Groundwater Sustainability Agency Formation in Sonoma County, Northern California, 2015-2017. Mediated agreements on governance for two emergent groundwater agencies, including legal structure, governing board structure, voting, initial funding, and public advisory component in two priority basins under California's Sustainable Groundwater Management Act. Convened meeting of elected officials from 9 public agencies to resolve final conflicts on voting and representation. Provided strategic consultation on countywide community engagement. Facilitated nine public workshops to solicit input and build widespread support and understanding. Conducted issue assessment with eligible agencies and stakeholders and conducted a joint evaluation with Sonoma County staff to assess issues and design a decision-making framework on the agency formation process.

Water Foundation Stakeholder Engagement Roundtable, California, 2015. Facilitated a 20-participant dialogue among diverse stakeholders in California water to provide feedback on a draft report on stakeholder engagement best practices for implementing the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act. Provided feedback to report authors, a group of environmental justice advocates and scientists, to reflect best practices in the field of stakeholder engagement and environmental conflict resolution.

Lower Russian River Wastewater Solutions Assessment, Northern California, Sonoma County, California, 2015. Conducted 30 interviews with stakeholders on wastewater treatment issues in small communities along the Lower Russian River, a protected water body. The state regulator was completing a study on the river's total maximum daily loads with wastewater as a significant contributing factor. Wastewater treatment has long been a controversial issue in the area, and the assessment determined that without regulatory requirements, community residents would be unlikely to improve onsite wastewater treatment systems. This coupled with concerns about the ability of homeowners to comply with new potential regulations given the physical constraints of the area, the assessment recommended that the two regulatory agencies convene an advisory group to develop recommendations to meet performance goals established through the regulatory study.

Mono Basin Mediation on Feasibility of Scientific Recommendations, Los Angeles, California, 2011-2012. Facilitated an effort of the California Department of Fish & Game, California Trout, the Mono Lake Committee, and LADWP to assess feasibility and develop terms for a new licensing agreement for LADWP's Mono Basin operations. Feasibility was associated with implementing flow recommendations to improve fisheries and habitat of Mono Basin streams while providing drinking water to Los Angeles; the flow recommendations were the culmination of a 12-year legally stipulated monitoring program.

Sonoma Valley Groundwater Management Plan Assessment and Facilitation, Sonoma, California, 2005-2008. Stakeholder Assessment, Process Design, Facilitation and Mediation. Conducted an assessment to explore technical issues and potential agreement for the groundwater planning in this rural wine-producing region. Based on the recommendations, the Sonoma County Water Agency established a 20-member diverse panel to negotiate groundwater management. The successful collaborative effort has

continued and is in its sixth year of implementing the adopted Plan.

Cosumnes, American, Bear and Yuba Rivers Integrated Regional Water Management Plan, El Dorado, California, 2006-2008. Facilitated development of a comprehensive integrated regional water management plan across four counties in the foothills of the Sierra Nevada Mountains. After nearly 25 diverse organizations and historic adversaries adopted the plan, the group created an independent regional entity to implement the plan and realize the regional benefits possible through projects improved through collaboration.

California Urban Water Conservation Council, Sacramento, California, 2008-2011. Facilitated various committees in this statewide membership organization. In 2008, she assisted the Steering Committee in negotiating the final agreements to revise the Best Management Practices—the guiding principles of water conservation for water agencies throughout California. In 2009, she facilitated a sub-committee that was negotiating a universal methodology to measure conservation.

California Water Plan, California, 2002-2003. Facilitated development of the statewide water plan that provides a framework for the California governor and legislature’s water management policy decisions. Sixty-five stakeholders developed an innovative strategic planning framework to assess 2030 water supply conditions and recommend management strategies.

Lower American River Task Force and Recreation Management Plan, Sacramento, California, 2000-2004. Facilitated monthly planning meetings consisting of city, county, regional, state, and federal agency representatives. The group coordinated management and projects for this river critical to flood safety and water supply in the Sacramento region. The collaborative produced the River Corridor Management Plan, as a step to updating the American River Parkway Plan, management recommendations and policies for a 23-mile trail adjacent to the river passing through an urban corridor striving to balance public access with habitat conservation.

Butte County, California, Water Resources Collaborative, Northern California, 2000-2001. Conducted situation assessment and designed process to engage more than 35 stakeholders representing water suppliers, farmers, environmentalists, and state and local agencies. The goal of the process was to secure future water supply through integrated resource management in county deeply divided on water issues. The group established a negotiation framework to develop basin management criteria to evaluate conjunctive management opportunities.

NATURAL & CULTURAL RESOURCES

Bay Adapt: Regional Strategy for a Rising Bay, San Francisco Bay Area, 2020-Present. Providing strategic guidance on process design and facilitating executive leadership advisory group of 30 governmental, nonprofit, and community leaders. Bay Adapt is an initiative to establish regional agreement on the actions necessary to protect people and the natural and build environment from rising sea levels.

San Francisco Bay Wetlands Regional Monitoring Program (WRMP) Regulatory Workshop Agency Facilitation. California, 2021. Worked with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, California’s San Francisco Regional Water Board, the Army Corps of Engineers, and the San Francisco Estuary Program to design and facilitate a workshop for regulatory agencies to consider aligning monitoring requirements across the San Francisco Bay based on the science-driven WRMP. The design involved two sessions: the first with agency leaders and staff who were able to meet together in facilitated discussions to identify opportunities and barriers to adopting a shared monitoring program. The second workshop was tailored

for on-the-ground staff to delve in to the details of implementing an aligned approach. As a result of the workshop, regulatory agencies were able to coalesce within the agency and also better understand monitoring requirements of other agency partners. WRMP leadership was able to craft a tailored approach to work with each agency after the workshop to move the program toward implementation.

Lake Tahoe West Restoration Partnership, California, 2019-2020. Facilitated collaboration among federal, state, and local agencies and stakeholders to address fire risk and landscape resilience across 60,000 acres of forested landscape in the Tahoe Basin. CBI provided facilitation, project management, and senior strategic leadership for project planning, permitting, environmental analyses (federal and state), and implementation. Senior project oversight and process design included managing the overall project work plan, sequencing and integration of the teams and their work products, identifying strategic next steps, and problem solving around emerging challenges.

Salinas River Long-Term Management Plan, California, 2018-2019. Conducted assessment, designed process, and facilitated multi-stakeholder planning group advising on the development of the plan. The goal is for this plan to provide the foundation for a habitat conservation plan. Key issues included invasive species management on private lands, fish passage, and ocean lagoon management.

Lake Tahoe Shoreline Plan, California, 2016-2018. Mediated policy and regulations for 72 miles of shoreline, including recreational access, boating facilities, piers, marinas, environmental improvement, and low lake level adaptation. Lake Tahoe is governed via a compact between the states of California and Nevada. Conducted stakeholder assessment, designed comprehensive mediation and outreach process, facilitated joint fact finding to seek input on scientific issues, mediated executive leaders' negotiations on policy, oversaw public outreach process, and advised on strategy and presented to governing board to create widespread support for policy that has been litigated seven times over for 30 years.

Bay Area Regional Collaborative Process Mapping on Sea Level Rise, California, 2016. Facilitated discussions among a small group of Bay Area experts to process map action underway and needed to address sea level rise, including research, government, community, and non-governmental organizations.

Salton Sea Strategy, California, 2016. Facilitated meeting between funders and non-governmental organizations to improve communication and coordinate strategy between California's Salton Sea and Colorado River Basin drought management.

South Fork of the American River Cohesive Strategy Facilitation, California, 2017-Present. Facilitating SOFAR collaboration among federal and state agencies, public and private land managers, and local stakeholders to address fire safety and ecosystem management in a large swath of land in the Sierra Nevada foothills.

Cotoni Coast National Monument Planning Meetings, Central Coast, California, 2018. Designed and facilitated large (100+ participants) interactive planning meetings with Bureau of Land Management to identify issues and opportunities for this Central Coast property becoming part of the Coastal National Monument. Prepared summary report outlining key themes for consideration for future planning.

Browns Canyon National Monument Situation Assessment and Stakeholder Engagement, Colorado, 2016-2017. Conducted situation assessment in parallel with human ecology mapping as part of national monument designation. Analyzed and developed representative list of stakeholders by interest nationally to support effective communication on monument management. Designed facilitated

listening sessions in project area. Developed report on assessment and crafted best practices to blend the stakeholder situation assessment with human ecology mapping process.

Cohesive Fire Strategy Situation Assessment, California, 2016. Conducted stakeholder issue assessment to make recommendations on collaboration among federal and state agencies, public and private land managers, and local stakeholders to address fire safety and ecosystem management in a large swath of land in the South Fork of the American River Watershed in the Sierra Nevada Mountains. Presented assessment recommendations at meeting with over 100 interested stakeholders.

Citizen Science Framework Development for the US Fish & Wildlife Service, Ft. Collins, Colorado, 2014-2015. Under contract with the US Institute for Environmental Conflict Resolution, conducted a neutral assessment and online survey with Fish & Wildlife staff to determine the current and potential benefits of citizen science within the agency. CBI contracted with the Cornell University Lab of Ornithology to conduct an independent science review. CBI then organized and facilitated a multi-day workshop involving expert participants from throughout the country to integrate the neutral assessment and science review into a proposed framework for refinement and use within the Service. The Service will use the framework to create a living document or guide for staff to develop unique citizen science projects in refuges across the United States.

San Gabriel Mountains National Monument Public Involvement Plan Development Facilitation, Vallejo and Los Angeles Region, California, 2015. After designation as a National Monument, facilitated public involvement team from the Angeles National Forest and Pacific Southwest Regional Office to develop a public involvement plan to share information and solicit input among the diverse stakeholders in the Los Angeles region on the development of the San Gabriel Mountains National Monument Plan. The meeting was an intensive 1.5-day effort that created a draft public involvement plan, including roles and responsibilities for public involvement team members and strategies to engage the diverse urban audience.

Forest Planning in the Pacific Southwest Region of the United States, California, 2011-2013. As the Forest Service embarked on its strategic planning process, known as forest planning, developed a collaborative model to guide stakeholder involvement for plan development. She has coordinated the model's implementation in three national forests, including assessments with staff internally, tribal governments, and other stakeholders. Used a collaborative approach to develop the guide, beginning with small groups of practitioners and Forest Service staff, then 20 stakeholders, and then 140 stakeholders from throughout California. The guide outlines legal frameworks, working with tribes and local governments, and understanding the Federal Advisory Committee Act. The guide provides a framework for conducting an external and internal stakeholder assessment and then developing a collaboration and communication plan to guide public engagement during plan development. The goal of this effort is for the national forests to collaborate with stakeholders and develop forest plans with widespread support.

Sierra Cascades Dialogue, California and Oregon, 2010-2013. Designed and facilitated the dialogue on the future of the Sierra Nevada and Cascades. The dialogue regularly brings together 140 public and private land managers and stakeholders to grapple with an "all lands" approach to planning and conservation and build the foundation for forest planning and future collaboration. Participants represent a broad range of stakeholder interests including government, communities, environmental, water agencies, youth and industry. Dialogue outcomes inform future Forest Service management decisions.

Sierra National Forest Project Development Mediation, California, 2009. Mediated a proposed restoration and timber sale project for the Sierra National Forest in an area that had been subject to lawsuits and conflict for more than ten years. The project applied a multi-disciplinary ecosystem management framework to achieve ecosystem restoration and increase public and firefighter health and safety.

Dinkey Creek Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Project, California, 2010-2013. Provided strategic counsel to facilitator working in the Sierra National Forest on project area known as Dinkey Creek. The Dinkey Creek Collaborative effort resulted after Bartlett's 2009 mediation. Group expanded project area and received expanded federal funding for 10-year effort to achieve restoration in this landscape vital for public and private lands and threatened and endangered species.

United States Forest Service Regional Roundtable on Planning Rule, California, 2010. Worked with Region 5 to design a dynamic session, held simultaneously in four locations with video feed, for 300 diverse stakeholders to have a say on the key issues in the Forest Service's new planning rule. The planning rule guides national forests in developing their individual forest management / strategic plans. Ms. Bartlett worked with staff to design an outreach strategy to ensure all interest groups, including youth, participated in the roundtable.

Stanislaus National Forest Stewardship and Fire Protection Meetings, California, 2005. Facilitated two-day meeting between environmental activists, timber industry representatives, and local community to reach agreements on fire management strategy. Worked with technical specialists to integrate scientific modeling. After initial meeting, facilitated several subsequent meetings to grapple with fire management and was able to reduce tensions on these issues in the stakeholder community.

Bay Area Water Trail Steering Committee, San Francisco, California, 2005-2006. Facilitated consensus-seeking steering committee to guide policy development and implementation of a plan to create the Bay Area Water Trail. Ms. Bartlett coached the project manager in managing a collaborative group, engaging interested stakeholders and negotiating mediating disputes.

San Francisco Bay Public Habitat Conservation and Access Policy Committee, San Francisco, California, 1999-2000. Designed and facilitated consensus-building dialogue among 20 diverse stakeholders to oversee related study and recommend policy to balance wildlife conservation with public access needs in the San Francisco Bay. Stakeholders included nonprofit environmental groups and federal and state resource agencies. The committee successfully developed and recommended policies for the Commission's approval.

American River Parkway Plan Update, Sacramento, California, 2003-2004. Facilitated multi-stakeholder group representing local and state government, recreation, historic preservationists, environmentalists and local foundation representatives working together to update and re-craft a long-standing plan governing the use and oversight of this 23-mile linear trail running adjacent to the American River. Key issues were balancing public access with habitat protection.

Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN) Consensus Building Playbook, international, 2020. Developed [consensus building playbook](#) to inform the multitude of consensus-seeking policy-making efforts of this international internet governance organization. Conducted

interviews with community representatives and drafted fifteen plays to assist the many groups that ICANN convenes to address complex, international issues on internet-related governance.

Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN), Los Angeles, Toronto, and Barcelona, 2018-2019. Mediator for the Expedited Policy Development Process on the application of the European Union's General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Mediated international body to develop global policies for internet governance to comply with GDPR, including data collection purposes, legal issues, liability, and commercial practices. Effectively facilitated 35 participants in four separate sessions to achieve session goals and outcomes.

ENERGY & EXTRACTIVES

Avian Solar Work Group, National, 2019-Present. Convene, design, and facilitate national collaborative of energy and conservation leaders seeking to advance responsible solar development by framing and encouraging independent scientific research to understand how birds interact with large-scale photovoltaic (PV) solar facilities. Formed in 2015, the ASWG's approach blends collaboration, issue identification, and active support for relevant research. CBI plays the role of convener and facilitator, facilitating the development and implementation of an annual work plan and documenting and tracking the group's decisions and accomplishments in the research field.

Potter Valley Partners Mediation, California, 2020-Present. Five parties formed a partnership to assume control of a hydroelectric facility with the goal of improving fisheries and guaranteeing water supply for two watersheds in Northern California. The parties call upon Bartlett periodically to mediate milestone agreements. In 2020, mediated an agreement among five parties and their attorneys on the project application to the Federal Energy and Regulatory Commission (FERC). In 2021, provided mediation and facilitation to craft agreement on strategy to move forward given significant uncertainty with the effort. The parties are the California Trout, County of Humboldt, Mendocino Inland Power Commission, Sonoma Water, and Round Valley Indian Tribes.

Potter Valley Hydroelectric Project Ad Hoc Committee Process, California, 2018-Present. U.S. Congressman Jared Huffman convened a diverse ad hoc stakeholder committee to develop recommendations for the future of the Potter Valley Project to inform the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission relicensing process. CBI mediated development of a project proposal among five parties, including tribal and county governments, water agencies, agricultural water district, and conservation organization. Initially, CBI designed and facilitated process for ad hoc policy makers' committee and two technical working groups (one focused on fish passage and the other modeling water supply scenarios) to conduct analyses and evaluation of fish passage technologies and water supply scenarios to craft recommendations to meet two-basin solution of improving fish passage and habitat and water supply reliability in two watersheds. CBI developed project website (pottervalleyproject.org) to promote transparency and share information. CBI continues to work closely with the Congressman, his staff, consultants, and planning agreement partners to advance efforts.

Altamont Pass Wind Resource Area Scientific Review Committee Facilitation, Bay Area. California, 2006-2010, Facilitated Scientific Review Committee's effort to identify management actions to reduce avian mortality in the Altamont Pass Wind Resource Area and to design a scientifically credible program of study to measure the associated change. Raptor mortality, in particular, has been a source of conflict and presented complex management and scientific challenges in this vast wind farm of nearly 4000 turbines east of the San Francisco Bay Area.

California Public Utilities Commission Divestiture Projects, Throughout California, 1998. Designed public involvement program identifying stakeholders, assessing issues, and developing communication materials to educate the public. Facilitated meetings throughout California soliciting public input on environmental review assessing impacts of restructuring California retail energy market.

AIR QUALITY

Owens Lakebed Master Plan Process, Lone Pine, California, 2010-2013. Facilitated development of a master plan for the historic Owens Lake in the Eastern Sierra. The Los Angeles Department of Water & Power, responsible for dust mitigation on the dry lakebed, convened a diverse collaborative to develop a master plan to achieve dust control while enhancing habitat and conserving water. The California State Lands Commission owns the land under the lakebed while the Great Basin Air Pollution Control District regulates air quality. These entities plus representatives of agriculture, local business, recreation, local, state, federal and tribal government worked together to develop the plan.

AGRICULTURE & COMMODITIES

Salinas Valley Agricultural Leaders Facilitation, California, 2018. Facilitated diverse group of agricultural leaders to help them prepare to contribute to the basin's groundwater sustainability plan. The purpose of the facilitated process is to share information and deepen understanding so agricultural leaders can participate effectively and advise their representative directors in the newly founded groundwater agency.

Fair Trade USA Coffee, Oakland, CA, 2017. Facilitated internal team focused on international, sustainable coffee production to confirm vision and priorities for measuring impact of program.

Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission Strategic Plan, Micronesia and Fiji, 2016. Facilitated development of strategic plan to set 10-year priorities. Commission is made up of 34-member countries that are implementing an international fisheries management agreement.
