Consensus Building and Stakeholder Engagement

Mass Moves — Sustainable Mobility for the 21st Century Commonwealth, 2016-present. Project Manager for public engagement effort to build a vision for sustainable mobility across Massachusetts. The effort is utilizing an advisory group of mobility leaders, nine public workshops as part of the Massachusetts Senate's Commonwealth Conversations, a dedicated website, a public survey, and other tools to help build a statewide vision that can help inform policymaking.

PEAK Grantmaking Process on Values-Based Grantmaking, 2016-present. Designing and facilitating a process to engage key stakeholders nationally to develop new, agreed-upon standards for grant-making practices among foundations and other grant-making institutions. The process seeks to articulate core values shared across grant-making institutions, and to spur discussion on how these values do or do not reflect themselves in these institutions' actual grant-making practices. The final output will be a set of agreed-on, voluntary standards for grant-making practices that institutions can choose to sign on to.

Assumable Waters Subcommittee, 2016-2017. Co-facilitated meetings of the Assumable Waters Subcommittee, convened under the National Advisory Council for Environmental Policy and Technology to provide advice and recommendations on how the EPA can best clarify which waters a state or tribe assumes permitting responsibility for under an approved Clean Water Act (CWA) section 404 program.

Public Workshops on New England's Regional Ocean Planning, 2014-present. Co-designed and facilitated multiple rounds of public workshops around New England for the northeast regional ocean planning effort. Led the drafting for a portion of the Northeast Regional Ocean Plan focused on stakeholder engagement. The meetings, located from Connecticut to down east Maine, have provided a variety of ways for the public to weigh in on the regional ocean planning work being done at key times. The CBI team has led regular day-long meetings for up to 100 members of the public on relevant topics prior to the work of the formal decisionmaking body.

BOEM State Task Forces on Offshore Wind Development, 2015-present. Co-facilitator of state task forces on wind energy development for BOEM in North Carolina, New York, and New Jersey. Assisting BOEM with informing stakeholders and addressing stakeholder concerns on key issues like auction initiation, environmental assessments, and others.

Supported the operations of the Multi-Stakeholder (MSG) Group Federal Advisory Committee to refine and hone the U.S. EITI on-line and written report, making available extensive interactive data sets, maps, and contextual information on the U.S. revenues from extractives.

World Bank, Conflict Prevention for Nepal Transmission Lines, 2015-2016. Working with the World Bank, which manages a substantial energy program in support of the Government of Nepal, to conduct an analysis of conflicts with local communities over siting, compensation and benefit-sharing associated with the development of major transmission lines. Proposing potential mechanisms for conflict prevention and mitigation in the future. Conducted field mission to Nepal in 2016. CBI is continuing to review relevant policies and practices, including a search for models for community engagement and grievance management from elsewhere that might be usefully adapted to the Nepali context.

GuideStar, 2015-2016. Co-facilitator leading the development of an advisory council of strategic thinkers from non-profits, foundations, technology platforms, consulting firms, researchers and donation platforms. This council will provide strategic advice to GuideStar as it seeks to continue to support the non-profit field by capturing and sharing great data and information. CBI's two-person team conducted an assessment of possible topics and roles for the council and is providing support in the convening and facilitation of early council meetings.

MISO Stakeholder Redesign Process, 2015. Member of team facilitating a dialogue process to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of MISO's governance process for member organizations. MISO is a 200-member regional transmission organization in the mid-West. Worked with a steering committee to conduct workshops to hone recommendations for process improvements.

Northeast Coastal Acidification Network, 2014-2016. Co-facilitator supporting a network of researchers, advocates, state and federal agency representatives and coastal industry

representatives to help design and facilitate a series of meetings with diverse stakeholders throughout New England. The day-long workshops were designed to gather input on a coordinated research and action plan for raising awareness about and taking action on ocean acidification, with one final stand-alone session on management options for coastal acidification. CBI produced all meeting summaries and a synthesis report capturing lessons learned.
