## Overview of expertise

With 16 years of international development and human rights experience, Clancy Moore is an expert in advocacy and anti-corruption. He has held leadership roles with ActionAid, Oxfam and Publish What You Pay and worked with communities across the Asia-Pacific and in South America. He has deep relationships and connections with anti-corruption and climate groups in the Asia-Pacific and internationally. He is the current CEO of Transparency International Australia overseeing anti-corruption programmes focussing on accountable mining, accountable infrastructure, political integrity and stopping dirty money. He is a leading media commentator and engages regularly with the private sector and government leaders on corruption issues and extractive industry transparency.

## Employment History

- **Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Transparency International Australia (2022 – current)**

- Leadership and strategic oversight of the Australian chapter of Transparency International with 7 staff undertaking research, advocacy and programs on mining, infrastructure, political integrity and dirty money to bring about a world free from corruption.

- Successful advocacy resulting in Australia's National Anti-Corruption Commission being legislated in December 2022 and 42% increase in media engagement.

- Oversight of TI's global Accountable Mining Program implemented in 23 countries focussing on addressing corruption in licensing, raising standards of business integrity and the energy transition.

- Ongoing leadership of CSO grouping on EITI in Australia and engagement with EITI standard, company and government constituency. Currently supporting multi-stakeholder processes with Pacific chapters and movement wide work on addressing corruption risks in transition minerals.

- Overall responsibility for media, fundraising, advocacy, company and government engagement.

- **National Director, Publish What You Pay Australia (2019 – 2022)**

- Led coalition of 26 organisations focussing on anti-corruption and transparency of the mining, oil and gas sectors so that communities share in the benefits of their natural resources and a just transition.

- Research and authoring of seven research papers and eight government submissions on extractive industry transparency.

- Policy wins include advocacy to ensure Australia and international mining, oil and gas companies divested from Myanmar, securing sanctions on two Russian oligarchs, policy commitments by opposition parties to advance the EITI, and Australia mining companies increasing disclosures of human rights risks.

- Increased coalition membership, secured new philanthropic donors and led movement wide strategic planning, research and policy development on energy transition and climate related disclosures.

- **Senior Manager/acting Director Advocacy and Campaigns, Asylum Seeker Resource Centre, Australia (2018 - 2019)**

- Strategic leadership, monitoring and evaluation of 3 teams, 10 staff and \$1.2 million annual program responsible for national programs to change policy and attitudes for people seeking asylum.

- Program development of UNICEF Australia's thematic multi-country strategies across the Asia-Pacific and engagement with DFAT.
